Tradition Four

Autonomy and Individual A.A. Groups

Long Form: With respect to its own affairs, each A.A. group should be responsible to no other authority than its own conscience. But when its plans concern the welfare of neighboring groups also, those groups ought to be consulted. And no group, regional committee, or individual should ever take any action that might greatly affect A.A. as a whole without conferring with the trustees of the General Service Board. On such issues our common welfare is paramount.

Short Form: Each group should be autonomous except for matters affecting

other groups or A.A. as a whole. .

Whoa!! This tradition means my group can do whatever it wants. We can exclude anybody from membership. We can donate our leftover money each month to the Joe Smucatella Senate campaign or the local detox center, instead of to A.A. service entities. We can include passages from the New Testament in our readings, along with Chapter 5 and Chapter 3. Or we can pretty much do anything we want to do as a group, provided it doesn't affect other groups or A.A. as a whole. Right?

In Bill's introduction of this tradition in March 1948, that is pretty much what he says. "The group's 'right to be wrong' would be held inviolate. We are sure that each group can be granted, and safely granted, these most extreme privileges.

We know that our familiar process of trial and error would summarily eliminate both the preacher and the night club. Those severe growing pains which invariably follow any radical departure from A.A.

tradition can be absolutely relied upon to bring an erring group back into line. An A.A. group need not be coerced by any human government over and above its own members. *Continued on Page 11*

With hardly a moments thought he replied, "Definitely Parkinsons!"



Their own experience, plus A.A. opinion in surrounding groups, plus God's prompting in their group conscience would be sufficient. Much travail has already taught us this. Hence we may confidently say to each group, "You should be responsible to no other authority than your own conscience."

However, later on in his introduction Bill reminds us that such extreme liberty of thought and action applies only to matters of the group's own affairs, and not other groups or A.A. as a whole. Which pretty much says that, for A.A. unity, those other traditions that provide di-



rection for our dealings with the general public, such as tradition 6, 7, 10 and 11,

should be observed at all times.

My late sponsor, Ken '45. used to say about this tradition, "Each tradition has a long form and a short form, but tradition 4 has a super-short form - It's none of your business, Nick!".




